Good Time	Eliminated
Earned Credit	No limit off non-mandatory stated terms 1 day per month (See Senate Bill 288 below)
House Bill 86	9/30/2011 to Present
Earned Credit	Participation Credit (8% limit) 0, 1 or 5 days per month depending on offense Sex offenses not eligible (See Senate Bill 288 below)
House Bill 49	9/29/2017 - retroactive
Earned Credit	Completion Credit (10% or 90 days whichever is less) Mandatory Offenses/Violent Offenses/Sex Offenses are not eligible (See Senate Bill 288 below)
Senate Bill 201	3/22/2019 to Present
Earned Credit	HB86 & HB49 apply to non-mandatory minimum and maximum sentence
Senate Bill 288	4/3/2024 to Present
Earned Credit	Participation Credit limit changed from 8% to 15% Completion Credit changed from one-time only to unlimited 0, 1 or 5 days per month depending on offense
